

Resolution Supporting Retaining a Peaceful Valley Community Center

A resolution expressing the interest in locating a multi-use building in Glover Field and requesting that the Spokane City Council and the Spokane Parks Department support the placement of such a building.

WHEREAS a Community Center located in Glover Field has had historical significance for the Peaceful Valley neighborhood for 60 years; and

WHEREAS the Peaceful Valley neighborhood has a strong interest in having a building located in Peaceful Valley that can serve the recreational, cultural and civic needs of the neighborhood; and

WHEREAS the Peaceful Valley neighborhood uniquely has no governmental, school or commercial buildings that could be used for such recreational, cultural or civic purposes if the current Community Center is removed; and

WHEREAS the Peaceful Valley neighborhood will be subjected to a significant amount of disruption for two years if a CSO tank is constructed in Glover Field; and

WHEREAS the Peaceful Valley neighborhood can only support the construction of a CSO tank in Glover Field if the neighborhood receives something in return;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Peaceful Valley Neighborhood Council as follows:

(1) We ask the Spokane City Council and the Spokane Parks Department to support the construction or placement of a multi-use building in Glover Field upon completion of the construction of a CSO tank in Glover Field; and

(2) We ask the Spokane City Council and the Spokane Parks Department to proactively work with city departments including Engineering Services, Wastewater Management, Planning & Development Services and Public Works and Utilities to identify funding sources and develop design plans for a multi-use building to be located in Glover Field and

(3) We ask the Spokane City Council and Spokane City Departments to work proactively with the area's Native American tribes in preserving the footprint and presence of the indigenous peoples in Glover Field.
